Notes: In early 1944, the German Government decided to reorganize its organization for propaganda to the enemy. The Wehrmachtpropagandaabteilung (Military Propaganda Section) was dissolved and the 6-Standarte "Kurt Eggers" replaced it. The 6 was considered more loyal and trustworthy, and its propaganda would be more in line with Nazi policy. Few records of this Kurt Eggers organization have survived the war for study by historians and collectors. Although Germany was clearly in decline, the leaflets show a spirit of vitality and ingenuity hardly seen until the present day. We offer a number of "Skorpion-West" leaflets for sale in this first "Sales List" of "The Leaflet Collector". The leaflets are arranged in alphabetical order according to the text of the title.

Dissemination was by rocket "Pr. Gs. 41" (Propagandageschoß 41) and by artillery shell 10,5 cm "Weiß-Rot-Geschoß", both being specially designed for this purpose. Because of the Allied air superiority airplane dispersion was seldom used. Rocket and artillery range was relatively small so leaflet dissemination took place in the front line only. This is the reason why these 6-leaflets are so seldom seen.

The first batch of 2000 leave men already arrived in England by plane to go by ship to the USA where they'll be lucky enough to spend 30 days at home. The government is granting leave enables Allied Headquarters to send all soldiers successfully on leave for 30 days.

There have never been similar leave regulations for British troops. You have always been neglected.

and on Dec. 16th the Germans launched their winter offensive. Now after the lapse of a few days German tanks have made deep penetrations into Belgium. One thing you know for certain: your all over with leave for allied soldiers now. Even if your higher command had now decided to grant you half of the leave which the USA gives to their soldiers. Be sure, this advantage has cost them heavy losses in dead and wounded.

Mr. Patterson, Secretary of State for War in the USA, recently mentioned the losses on the Western front right up to the beginning of the German offensive amounting to some 300 000 men or 25 divisions i.e. half of the Allied Forces fighting in Western Europe.

Since Dec. 16th 30 000 prisoners have been brought in during the first week. As you know from experience the casualties are higher and even the most careful estimates put them down at 120 000 to 180 000 men.

And there is still another point to remember. The storm may break out in your sector of the front at any moment. Make up your mind whether you want to be one of the 30 000 or one of the 180 000. Your higher command won't be able to grant you leave in view of the „Battle of Bulge“ events of which are precipitating. Once you are with us you can get leave and even more than 30 days.

Leave till the end of the war!

Remember! Dead men better return, but prisoners of war will immediately go home once when war is over. Germany has signed the Hague and Geneva Conventions and respects the rights of prisoners of war.

How big is your Chance?

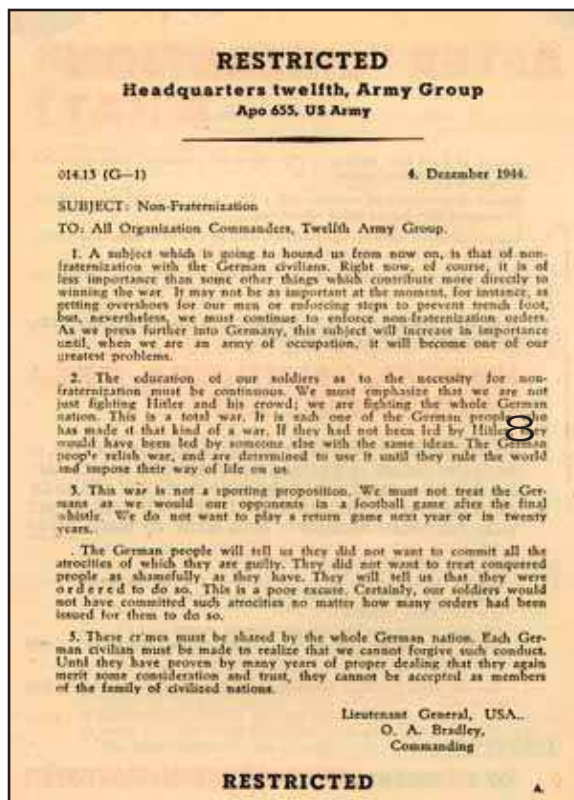
Every soldier can reckon approximately how long he will last on the front. Since D-Day very conclusive statistics have been made in regard to American losses.

Accordingly the average "Length of Life" on the front is:

Soldiers	64 days
N. C. O's	59 days
Platoon leaders	51 days
Com. commanders	48 days

These figures indicate that the average soldier in his respective rank group remains in active front service 48-64 days

The reasons why:

1. German U-boats, German bombers and the German fleet sink and seriously damage between them every month a total of 700 000 to 1 million tons of British and allied shipping.
2. All attempts at finding a satisfactory means of defence against the German U-boats or the German bombers have failed disastrously.
3. Even President Roosevelt has openly stated that for every five ships sunk by Germany, Britain and America between them can only build two new ones. All attempts to launch a larger shipbuilding programme in America have failed.
4. Britain is no longer in a position to secure her avenues of supply. The population of Britain has to do with about 8 the ration that the population of Germany gets. Britain, herself, can only support 40% of her population from her own resources in spite of the attempts made to increase the amount of land under cultivation. If the war is continued until 1942, 60% of the population of Britain will starve!

All this means that starvation in Britain is not to be staved off. At the most it can be postponed, but whether starvation comes this year or at the beginning of next doesn't make a ha'porth of difference. Britain must starve because she is being cut off from her supplies.

The British press was allowed to reprint this leaflet and added an article with the headline “Here are the facts:...”

Im Zusammenwirken mit Panzern und Artillerie drangen die verbündeten Truppen bis in die Stadt Dieppe vor. Während der Aktion spielte sich eine der größten Luftschlachten dieses Krieges ab. Die Deutschen mußten Fliegerverstärkungen aus sämtlichen Gebieten des besetzten Frankreich, Holland und Belgien heranholen. Bei dieser Luftschlacht verloren die Deutschen mehr als 200 Flugzeuge, d. h. ein Drittel ihrer gesamten im Westen stationierten Luftwaffe. Nachdem die englisch-amerikanische Landungstruppe ihre Aufgabe durchgeführt hatte, kehrte sie unter Mitnahme von gefangenen deutschen Soldaten und Offizieren nach England zurück. Beim Abzug aus der Stadt riefen die englischen Soldaten den Franzosen zu: „Wir kommen wieder!“

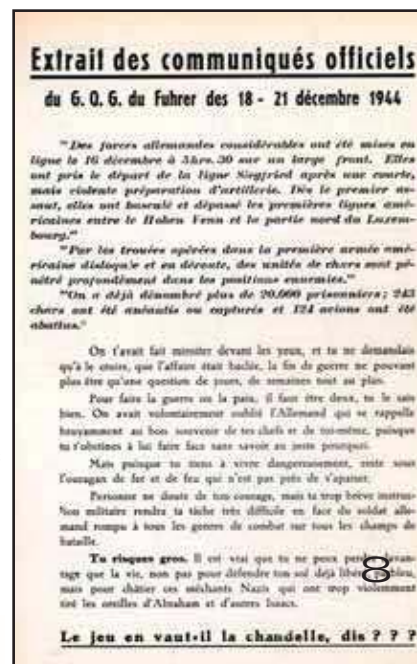

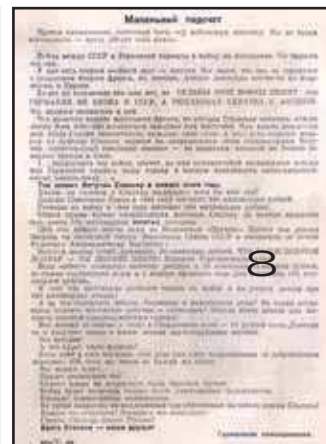

1943 – 1944 USA (OWI) Series: USG → Germans

Notes: In World War II the United States of America produced leaflets for the enemy i.e. Germans and the inhabitants of German occupied countries, beginning in 1942. Offered here are those leaflets disseminated for Germans in Germany in August 1943 to September 1944 only. The British Government had been disseminating leaflets to the Germans since the first day of World War II. Starting in May 1944 leaflets of American-British origin had been used (XG-series by PWE/OWI). The dissemination of Allied leaflets produced by Supreme Headquarters Allied Expeditionary Forces/Psychological Warfare Division (SHAEP/PWD) continued until the last day of WW II. In this section here, only USG-series leaflets are offered for sale.
